What does In Person Engagement Look Like?

- Verbal Communication
 - Raised hands
 - Asking questions/responding to questions
 - Thorough class discussion
- Non-Verbal
 - Body language
 - Eye contact
 - Facial expressions

Strategies for Engagement



Strategies

- Schedule/structure of workshop
- Variety of interactions
- Content
- Building community
- Learning motivation



Schedule/structure

- Plan workshop in small chunks:
 - Adults: 10 minutes per topic or activity
 - Younger groups: 3-5 minutes
 - Youngest: Plan for breaks and changes
- Topics: 1-2 per workshop
- Structure: Information - Application - Knowledge Check (I do, we do, you do)





Variety of interactions

- Comfort Zone
- Offer options: Chat, Microphone, Reactions
- Engagement: Zoom features, Questions/reflections

Content Engagement

- Balance, multi-modal (visuals, audio, examples)
- Guest speakers
- Videos
- Discussion



Building Community

- Set expectations (netiquette)
- Names, pronouns
- Icebreakers
- Invite, acknowledge and celebrate various perspectives
- Seek learner feedback



Learner Motivation

- Extrinsic motivators
- Intrinsic motivators
